



## **Walworth Primary School**

Walworth is a primary maintained school for children who have special educational needs aged 4 to 11 years. Our pupils attend from areas within the County of Durham and some further afield. We have achieved a good grade from our last Ofsted inspection (2018). We have achieved the Wellbeing Award for Schools (July 2019, we are in the process of getting reaccreditation this year) which demonstrates a national standard for positive mental health and emotional wellbeing. We are currently in the process of getting a reaccreditation. Attached to our school is our Residential Unit 'Acorn House' which provides flexible accommodation for up to ten boarders and has provision for five extended day pupils, which is available by a referral system dependant on the child's needs. Acorn House offers a wide range of activities, many aimed at developing social skills, peer skills, health and hygiene and good bedtime routines.

- A curriculum and residential care provision designed to meet the needs of all children with a variety of SEND.
  - Support from highly trained staff who are sensitive to the needs of children with SEN and their families.
- Specialist External Professional Support from other services employed within the school setting Primary Mental Health Key Worker (CAMHS), Occupational Therapist (Future Steps) and an Educational Psychologist (LA).
- A variety of teaching methods to take into account the various preferred learning styles.
- A Parent Support Advisor (PSA) to ensure support networks are available to all.
- Information to support children's development, progress and communication between school and home in relation to the variety of additional events.
- A Governing Body and Leadership Team committed to embedding the principles of the vision, aims and ethos of the school.
